
Freeman Professor Michael Hogg Featured in Bloomberg Businessweek

That may mean field trips to trial court or Home Depot or test questions that incorporate student Facebook photos to create a relevant — and usually funny — story.

"Students often laugh during tests," Hogg tells *Bloomberg Businessweek*. "That's a little weird."
