

Dean Solomon announces Art Inclusivity Task Force

As a part of efforts to enhance diversity and inclusion within the Freeman School, Dean Ira Solomon has announced a new Freeman School Task Force on Art Inclusivity. The Task Force is charged with: (1) developing a rationale and proposing a process for determining the art that is to be displayed within the Freeman School's Goldring/Woldenberg Business Complex and Stewart Center CBD; and (2) reviewing art currently displayed in the Freeman School's buildings. The Task Force will make its recommendations to the dean by the end of fall term 2020.
