**Why did you decide to major in business?**

I am very interested in the role that business can play by bringing together people from all walks of life who have differing skill sets to solve some of our most pressing societal issues. Due to the fast moving nature of business compared to the public sector, I view majors revolving around business as providing opportunities to centralize awareness, communication and technology while executing ideas focused on collective social good.

Through the Altman Program in International Studies & Business, I have had access to additional applications for my business degree as I studied abroad for a full year and obtained a liberal arts degree simultaneously.

**I consistently found myself fascinated by...**

The role that technology access and training can play in creating more personalized learning environments, especially for those with learning disabilities that may struggle to effectively contribute to and benefit from traditional classroom models.

**What was your favorite course and why?**

Professor Rob Lalka's Student Venture Accelerator Course. This two-semester class provides student teams of 4 to 5 people the opportunity to create their own startup while receiving credit and guidance throughout. This class followed the venture creation process from idea to pre-launch. With the help of Professor Lalka's teaching and mentorship, myself and three others created a video job board for boutique hotels focused on revamping the hiring process and increasing transparency for both parties, in order to ultimately reduce misalignment between new employees and the skill sets demanded to support the unique guest experience created by boutique hotels.

**Who is your favorite business professor? What made them special?**

Professor Myke Yest & Professor Rob Lalka are my two favorite business professors.

Professor Lalka consistently pushed me to think past what I thought was possible for our student venture while still applying our discussions to topics covered in class or in his career. At the same time, he also provided me with individual mentorship to support my career advancement while helping me reflect on crucial decisions without pushing me towards a specific direction or answer.

Professor Yest, as a director of the Altman Program and Freeman professor, continually advocated for me throughout my four years at Tulane. He provided me with a supportive outlet and continually championed my success throughout some of my most difficult moments at Tulane. He also frequently checked in on me and was determined to provide anything I needed to be successful.
