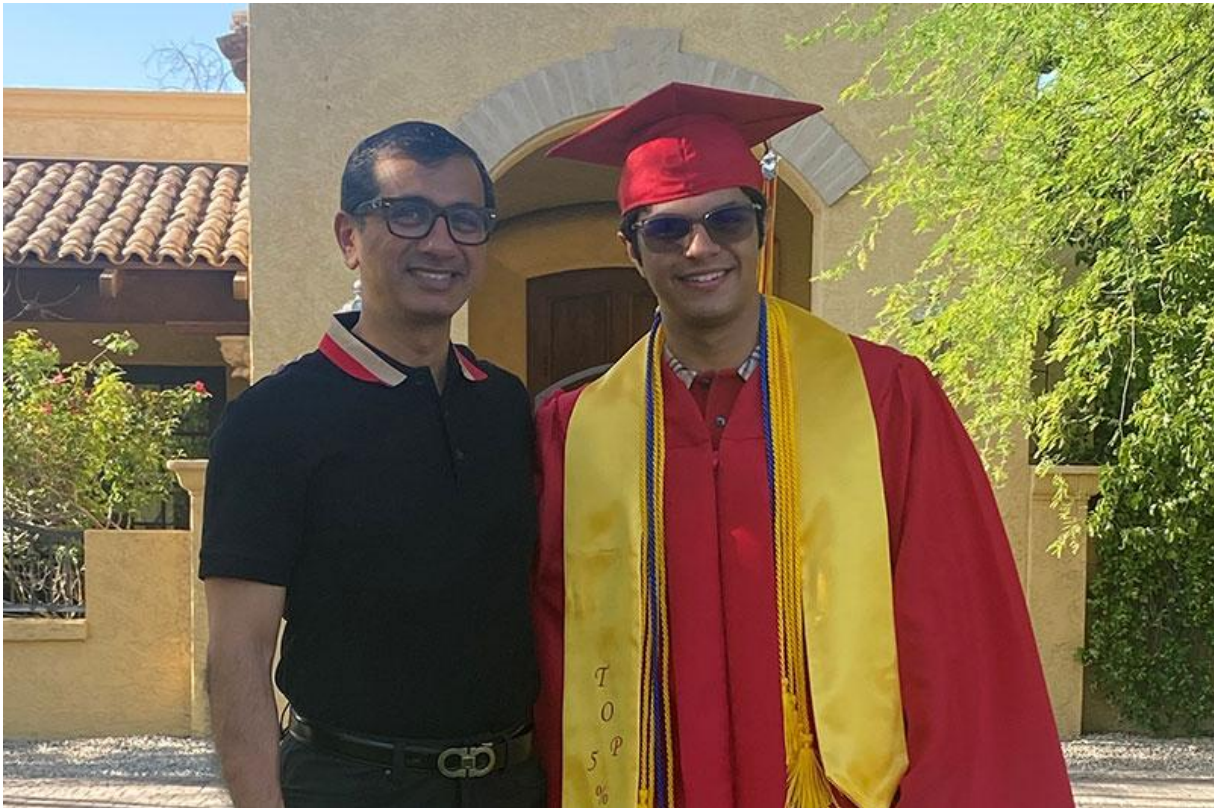


A Family Affair: Tulane's Executive MBA Brings Parents and Children Together
