Lantz previously served as the CMC's director of employer engagement, where she led initiatives that resulted in a 50% increase in on-campus recruiting activity since 2023, including the coordination of 150 recruitment events in the past academic year.

"She brings invaluable institutional knowledge and established relationships to the role, attributes that will enable her to make an immediate impact.
