I interned at Empire Midstream, and they recruited me from Tulane. I had a finance and business development role.

In a few sentences, describe your responsibilities during the internship.

I supported Empire Midstream's commercial and business development efforts by generating production forecasts, market insights, and financial analyses that informed pipeline acquisitions, equity transactions, and strategic proposals. My work strengthened deal valuations, improved decision-making around throughput and tariff risk, and helped assess the commercial feasibility of multiple midstream opportunities.

Can you share a memorable moment or experience from your internship that had a significant impact on your professional growth?

We took a field trip to Empire's terminal in Gibson, Louisiana, and we got to see how they unload oil from the vessels!
